The AMDA Foundation meets these pillars by:

1. Developing and running world class industry expositions and conferences to promote Australian industry both within Australia and globally. These events enable Australian companies to promote themselves and seek business opportunities. These forums enable the companies to promote themselves with the Australian public to enhance their ability to attract and retain staff and to broaden their contacts.
2. Promote and develop a range of industry and public focused student engagement programs, including scholarships as part of a formal careers and skills programs, with the aim of promoting interest in careers in the fields of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics.
3. Provides innovation awards to provide financial rewards to assist innovative Australian companies and researchers. There are currently three awards known as the National Industry awards, SME innovation awards and the young innovator awards.

The AMDA Foundation has developed a policy for determining its surplus requirements. Given the substantial cost of the airshow it has been determined that the first \$30m in reserves is held to meet potential obligations in event of event cancellation or weather impediments to the successful running of an airshow. The policy also allows for a further sum to be withheld to assist with Capital requirements and Working Capital to fund existing and future developed events.

The foundation then has a process to allocate surplus funds to meet the above activities identified in the five pillars. In the current year the Foundation has taken over the Wings over Illawarra airshow with the objective of enhancing this show to promote careers in regional aviation, particularly the career opportunities in skills that support aviation i.e. engineers, maintenance and other technical roles.

The foundation has also increased the value of the innovation awards and is looking to expand its scholarship program to underrepresented disciplines needed to support Australian High Technology Industries.
